How to read the results table:-

- i) The portable stations are always along the top and give location and date. Signals received by them are in BLACK.
- ii) Stations in red are base stations - the exception is G4PSH/A which is normally at Sutton ATC. On 16/3 however it was located at QTHR. Signals received by them are in RED.
- iii) NOA represents Not On Air.
- iv) No copy means the station could not hear the transmitting station.
- v) gd readable means that although the signal strength might be weak, it is possible to work traffic between stations.

Notes

Please forward your signal reports to me a.s.a.p. If you don't know my email address, then use the contact on the web site.

To help us get a good overall picture, if, your QTH is not listed, then please tell me where it is when you email your signal reports. The call out list can be a bit "general" in locations e.g. Norwich is rather a large area!

Don't expect me to remember your signal reports from the net - I am very good at loosing pieces of paper - including my own record of signal reports (this is in the distance of 3m between my radio and my main computer . . .) - fortunately, I haven't so far lost a computer!
